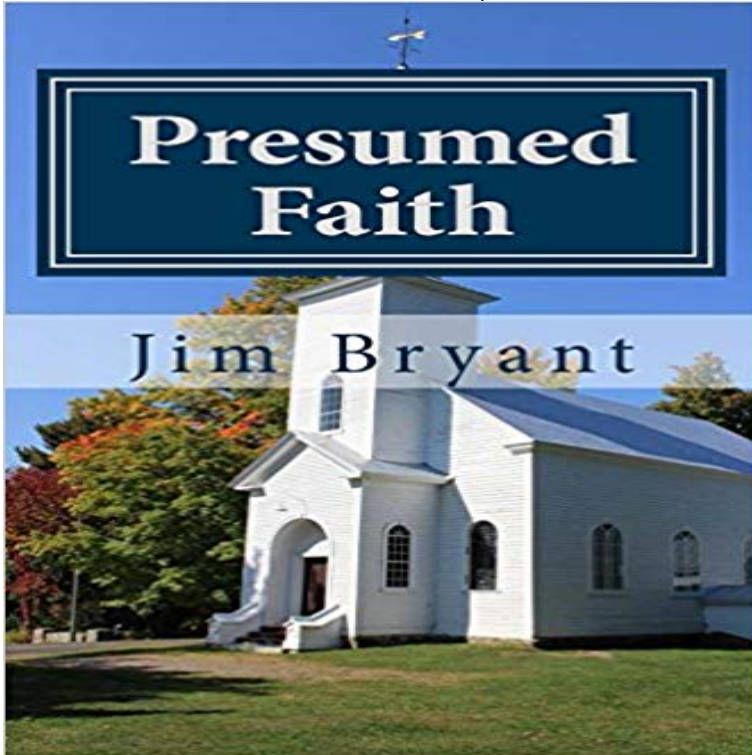


Presumed Faith: A Study of 1 John Verse-by-Verse
