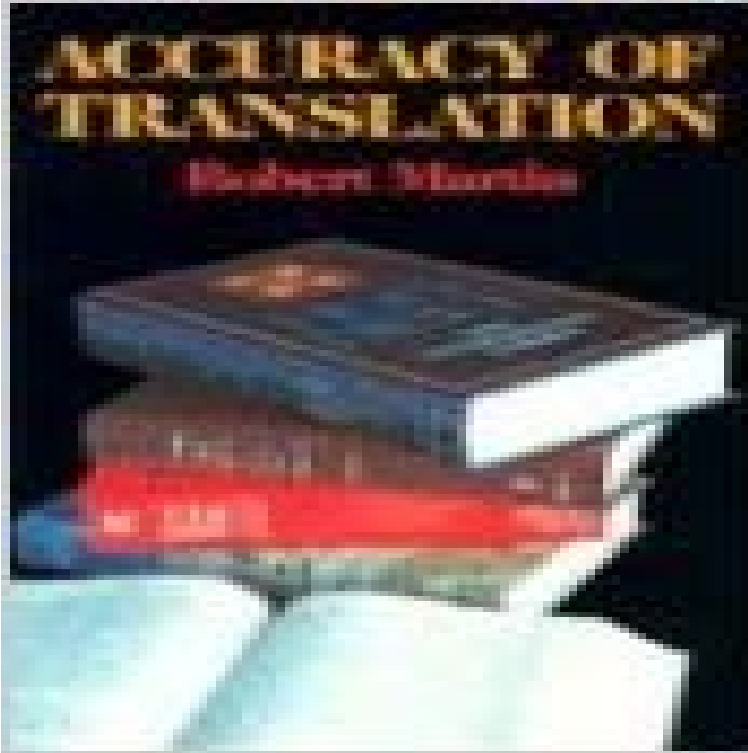


Accuracy of Translation: The Primary Criterion in Evaluating Bible Versions With Special Reference to the New International Version



Recent debate on gender-neutral versions of the Bible has again raised the question of how the Word of God should be translated. Robert Martin argues that the verbal nature of inspiration can only be honoured if preference is given to a formal equivalence. His study not only presents a critique of the NIV, but also provides insights into Scripture which will help every reader to appreciate the richness of Gods Word and the benefit of careful Bible study.
